

# DOMINICAN REPUBLIC BUSINESS VISA

Documents	Particulars
Passports	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* Original Passport with atleast 6 months validity and atleast 2 blank pages.</li> <li>* Original old passport booklets if any</li> </ul>
Photographs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* 2 photographs each</li> <li>* White background; Glossy finish; 80% face coverage with a little shoulder to be seen; Eyes and face to be clearly visible; Dimensions: 45mm x 35mm</li> </ul>
Visa Forms	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* Duly typed visa forms by the applicants with signatures</li> <li>* Signatures for children (below 18 years) to have both parents's signatures along</li> </ul>
Covering Letter	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* A covering letter per individual / family/ company addressed to The Visa officer, Embassy of the Dominican Republic. The covering letter has to be translated into Spanish.</li> <li>* The Covering Letter should brief the profile of the applicants and the purpose of travel with travel dates</li> <li>* Covering Letter can be on a plain paper for individuals and on the company letterhead for officials / sponsored applicants</li> </ul>
Bank Statements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* Bank letter mentioning the date of opening of the account, annual average balance maintained during the year and the date of last Deposit. This letter has to be submitted along with a Spanish translation.</li> </ul>
Itinerary / Air tickets	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* Return airtickets with all internal flight / train tickets if any</li> <li>* Day wise itinerary of the tour</li> </ul>
Purpose of Travel / Accommodation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* Covering letter from the Company – explaining the purpose of trip. A Spanish translation should also be submitted.</li> <li>* Invitation letter from The Dominican Republic in Spanish which should be notarized and legalized by Procuraduría General de la República Dominicana. The letter must have a clause which goes as: “Garantizo que (nombre, nacionalidad y pasaporte), no permanecerá en la República Dominicana más tiempo que el concedido por la Dirección General de Migración, ni solicitara residencia o cambio de estatus migratorio desde el territorio dominicano, dedicándose exclusivamente a la actividad por la cual le fue otorgado el visado. Me hago moral y económicamente responsable de su retorno a su país de origen, asumiendo pagar a favor del Estado Dominicano cualquier gasto en que dicha persona pueda incurrir durante su estancia en el país, o que se origine como consecuencial de su repatriación o deportación del mismo”.</li> <li>* Dominican ID (Cedula) or Migration Status of the Guarantor</li> <li>* Document stating that the Guarantor is authorized to sign on behalf of the company.</li> <li>* PCC (Police clearance certificate) - Apostille (if applicable)/attested by Ministry of External Affairs/ Ministry of Foreign Affairs with the respective government) (submitted along with its translation in Spanish).</li> <li>* Hotel vouchers or other accommodation proof as applicable.</li> </ul>

The Embassy / Consulate/ High Commission/ Application Centres hold the rights to demand further documents for verification.</li> <li>* The Embassy / Consulate / High Commission hold the rights to call the applicant for a Personal Interview if needed</li> <li>* BPVS offers Visa Facilitation services to our customers against a Service Fee</li> <li>* BPVS at no stage guarantees the outcome of any visa application.
